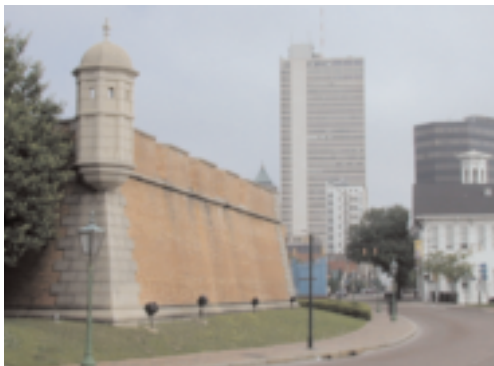

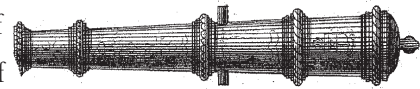

Located next to The Museum of Mobile, Fort Condé is a replica of



the original 18th century French brick fort on that site. The present structure was built in celebration of America's 1976 bicentennial. The historic section houses artifacts and exhibits related to the three colonial periods of Mobile history. 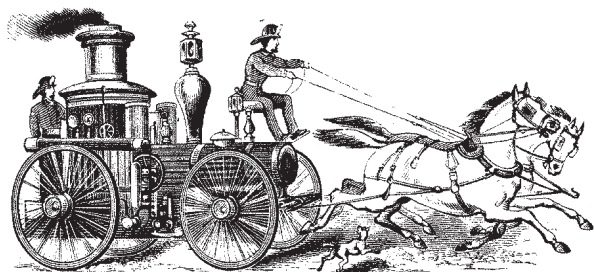
